




Home Learning Activity - Maths

1. Plant your own seed. It could be anything. Keep a diary and watch how it grows!
2. Jack's mum was very cross with Jack when he came back! Write in a speech bubble what she could have said to him when he came back with the magic beans!
3. Imagine if you were Jack and you climbed to the top of the beanstalk! What would you see? Draw a picture of what you could find at the top of the beanstalk and label the different parts. For ideas, there is a map at the end of the Youtube clip!
