Physical Education

Maths

Knowing and understanding the times tables is an essential skill. Year 3 expectations are 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 10 and Year 4 times table expectations are 2-12x. Keep an eye out for more information on 'Times Tables Rock Stars'. Please have conversations about maths in everyday life e.g. shopping and reading an analogue and digital clock. To support your children with Maths homework, please ask the children about the method that they have been learning (or ask a member of the class staff).


Homework
