Curriculum Info

In addition to our main topic learning, some subjects need to be taught discretely (not always making direct links to the topic). This term we will also be covering:

Phonics & Reading - taught daily

Maths - Number and calculation

RE: Giving Thanks (including Harvest)

PSHE: Beginning and Belonging

PE & Games: Real P.E and Dance (linked to the Great Fire of London)

Computing - word processing and navigating simple programmes on laptops

Music - Explorina sounds

Reading & Phonics

Daily reading at home and practising high frequency words and phonics is a vital part of homework for KS1 children as they learn to read more fluently.

Please try to read **every day** with your child and record this in the Home/School Diary. Children will only change their books if it has been signed. It is good to discuss the meaning of new vocabulary and talk about the illustrations. Asking your child to retell the story or answer questions about what they have read is great for developing comprehension.
