Reading Diaries

Maths

Year 4 pupils are now expected to know and recall up to the 12 times table. With this in mind it would be greatly appreciated if your child could be encouraged to practise at home as well as school to help ensure we meet these expectations. Homework

There will be no changes to the current set up of homework this term. Please be assured that any task sent home for homework is designed to extend or consolidate the work the children have done in class.

Weekly spellings - taught throughout the week in school and where possible to be practised at home. As usual these will be placed in the reading diaries.

Until the end of the year PE will take place where possible, on a Tuesday and Wednesday, however it is very important that each child has the correct kit in school throughout the week as this may change due to inclement weather or other events.
