Covid-19 Update

Thank you to everyone for adapting to our new drop off and pick up times. We are pleased in the way that this is working although we do feel that there are a few issues emerging from observations of the first full week. The first group (8.45am drop off) appears to be bigger than any other group indicating that some families are coming to school sooner than they should. We have carefully constructed the planned arrival and departure times to ensure that the footfall at each time is as small as possible. Next week, class based staff will be checking which children are arriving earlier than they should and we will then facilitate a conversation with the identified parents to remind of allocated times. If you are unsure about the time you should be arriving/departing, please contact the school office to ask.

We have noticed that there are parents and children arriving at the gates for around 8.30am. Please note that the gates will not open until 8.45am for the first group of arrivals and arriving any earlier than this encourages people to engage in the social interaction we are trying to avoid.

Please try and stick to one adult dropping off and collecting as we have risk assessed for a certain number of people on site at any one time and more adults dropping and collecting is not in line with our agreed protocols and procedures. If one adult undertakes to collecting/dropping off, the other adult must remain outside of the school property.

Should parents wish to wear a face covering, you are more than welcome to do so as we are unable to guarantee that everyone will always remain 2m apart, particularly during the busiest times.

With this in mind, the rules for socialising with friends and family are changing from next week as set by the government. The new rules, which come into force on Monday, mean that no more than 6 people (of any age) can meet inside or outside for the foreseeable future to help bring down the spike in Covid-19 cases that the country is currently experiencing (this does not affect education-we still expect full attendance). We are relying on all parents and carers to follow the social distancing/meeting rules in place so that we can all play our part in minimising the threat of infection. Clearly, we have all seen the benefits of our school being back open and we want to ensure that everything that happens from here on in helps protect the school from the threat of closure within a local lockdown scenario. Thank you in advance for your support with this-it is clear that the disruption the virus is causing is wearing on us all but it is important that we continue to work together to keep the school open and the children learning with smiles on their faces!

Harvest Festival-changes for 2020


Parent Letters from Class Teachers
