Having held a recruitment process earlier in the term, we have been able to secure an excellent class teacher who will be teaching Year 4. Miss Harriet Walker will be joining us in September as she moves to us from her current post and she is incredibly eager to begin working with us. The children will have the opportunity to meet her on 10th July when she will be in school for the Moving Up Morning.

Staffing for 2019/20

We have been busy allocating Class Teachers for the next academic year. We are pleased to be able to retain our 7 class structure for the mornings and offer mixed age class during the afternoon in Key Stage 2. This arrangement has worked incredibly well this year and has meant that the children have been able to be taught in single age year groups for the core areas of the curriculum in the morning with the non-core elements of the curriculum taught during the afternoon. The only way we are currently able to offer single age classes across the school is to utilise the hall as a teaching space and it is now our aim to provide this option all day in the future by striving for a dedicated 7th teaching space. Obviously, gaining this space will take time but it is now our aim to divert all available funding streams and fundraising towards securing this for our school. We are working to a suggested figure of £50,000 and look forward to working with all of our school stakeholders and partners to raise the money and secure the additional classroom; which will not only have an incredible impact on pupil outcomes but again, help to develop the school for the current generation of children as well as the next.
