Parking Reminder-Urgent attention required from all drivers

Dear Parents and Carers,

It is with a very heavy heart that I am writing this reminder to parents in a week where tragic events outside nearby schools has resulted in the unimaginable happening and children have lost their lives in road traffic accidents.

In light of this, and due to a recent flurry of complaints from parents, our attention simply must turn to the parking decisions being made by parents of our children at picking up and drop off times outside our own school. The decisions each motorist makes is directly the responsibility of the driver and we are becoming increasingly concerned that someone is going to get hurt and we are sure that nobody wants the harm of others on their conscience.

We need everyone who drops off their children in a car and parks in the vicinity of the school to think about how you are driving and where you are leaving your car. Please do not park on the zig-zag lines outside school or on the corner of a junction. Have respect for local residents and their houses and consider whether you actually need to drive your child to school. We would also ask that parents refrain from using the school car park as this is reserved for staff parking and children being dropped off via their taxi.

We do understand that many parents are very busy and you may be rushing to get to work after drop off, but some of the decisions that are being made are putting our children at risk! If you have an accident with your children in the car, you are also putting your own child(ren) at risk. We are urging drivers to have consideration for those crossing the roads and to look behind them and make sure that there are no children behind a car before reversing etc. Often, as children and young people are smaller, they are harder to be seen.

Please can we ask that EVERY parent works together to ensure that everyone is kept safe as we do not want there to be any further children hurt outside of any school gates.

As a school, we always advocate park and stride and would like to remind people that the option to park at the Social Club and walk the short distance to school is available. We are discussing the option to reinstate a crossing patrol with Lincolnshire County Council and our Mini Police will also be working with the PCSO to issue 'parking tickets' to drivers who park in a dangerous manner. We are also working with the highways department to look at the road markings to ensure that the signage and markings are as clear as possible and ensuring that the road safety partnership and police begin to make regular patrols.

We are keen to force a change in this area before someone is hurt as the result of carelessness but this will only happen if everyone works together to ensure that those travelling on foot, in and around the school, are safe.

Thank you in anticipation of the improvement we expect to see.

Start of School Day Routines

Please can we take this opportunity to remind parents that the school is not accessible in the morning before we open the gates.

We are repeatedly asked to open the gates earlier than 8.45am but this is not possible as we have to maintain site security and we ensure our gates are manned at all times. Please note that these times will not change even if it is raining and entering the school foyer to wait is not an option. We need to leave the rooms at the front of school available for meetings.

Whilst waiting for the gates to open, the children are the responsibility of the adult dropping them off and as such, they should be supervised as the car park may be busy with children being dropped off in their taxi.

One issue we have found is that some parents/children arrive very early to school and are then having to wait for a longer period. Please be reminded that once the gates are opened, they will be manned and remain open until 9am. If children arrive after 9am, it is only at this point that a late mark will be recorded and children will need to enter via the main office.
