We have had some wonderful feedback regarding the Parenthub app that we are now using to help ensure effective communication streams with our parent body and we are delighted with the number of parents who have begun to access the app.

What parents appear to be most impressed with is the fact that the app allows for all of the messages sent by school to be seen in one place, eradicating the numerous emails we sent out to parents, and ensuring that important messages can be seen at the click of a button.

We do still have a number of parents who have not yet signed up to the app and the only equipment that is needed is a smartphone and access to the internet. We do recognise that an app will take up space on a phone but we have been reassured that the actual size of the application is very small and the information stored within the app is less than the number of emails that were sent previously.

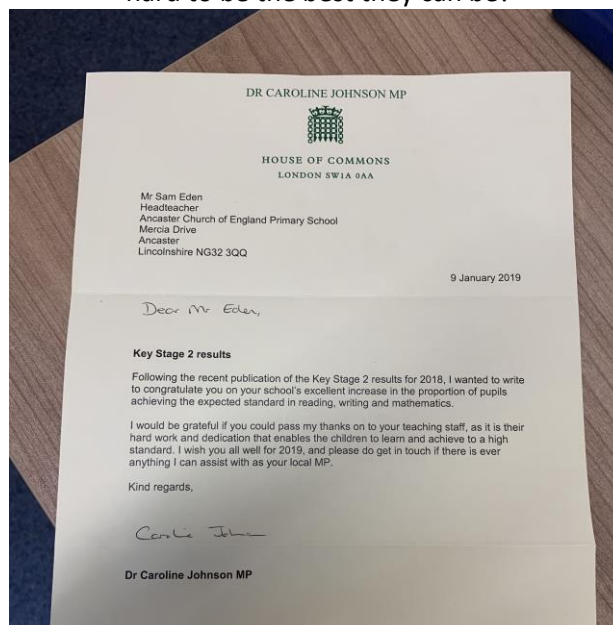

### Headlice

Further to an update via Parenthub sent this week, children have been reminded not to put their heads close together, not to share hair bobbles etc, to always wear long hair tied up and to support one another and not make them feel bad if they have had headlice.

Please be reminded that there is no need for a child to miss school if they have headlice-many of the treatments can be administered quickly but please remember to keep checking up to 10 days after treatment to remove any eggs as it is eggs not removed by the treatment that is often the cause of children getting headlice again. Thank you to the parents who have already taken steps to ensure we bring any problem into line.

We do have treatments available to give to families free of charge-if you would like any of these, please let us know and we will be happy to help.

### Suitable Clothing

Winter is truly upon us now and the cold snap is set to continue for the foreseeable weeks. With this in mind, please can all parents ensure that children are coming to school with a warm, winter coat as we do not want to let children outside without this vital protection from the very cold weather.
