Ann touched the lives of so many people, not least those who were lucky enough to have been in her care across those glorious 30 years of working at Ancaster. New School Uniform

Visiting the School Office

We have an intercom system that will need to be pressed which will allow you to speak to school staff in the office and they will release the door lock leaving you to open it and enter the school.
