Snacks, Lunchboxes and Drinks



We have been noticing recently that there has been a rise in the number of unhealthy foods that are being sent into school for snacks at breaktimes and also in lunchboxes. In recent weeks, we have seen children bringing into school packets of Haribo sweets, as well as other treats which should not be in school.

In terms of snacks for playtime, please only send in healthy snacks for the children. In Reception and Key Stage 1, a snack is provided each day by the Government in the form of fresh fruit and vegetables. Should any child from Key Stage 2 wish to purchase healthy snacks, we do operate a healthy tuck shop in which children can buy their snacks.

Lunchboxes should contain a variety of food groups.

We recognise that a packet of crisps or a small chocolate bar are part of a balanced and healthy diet, but please consider the types of foods that are being placed into the lunchboxes as we do promote healthy lifestyles as much as possible and this is especially extended to mealtimes.

In terms of the drinks being sent into school, please only send water into school as this will ensure that the children are hydrated and ready to learn.
