Becoming a Volunteer

Anyone wishing to become a volunteer, either for a one off event (such as a school visit), or on a more regular basis (e.g. hearing children read), should approach the Head teacher, who will be pleased to explain the volunteering opportunities at our school in more detail and answer any questions prospective volunteers may have. Volunteers will be invited to complete a Volunteer Information Sheet with their contact details, type of activities they would like to help with, and the times they are available to help.

Before starting to help in school, volunteers will also be asked to complete the Volunteer Agreement which sets out the school's expectations of volunteers but, just as importantly, explains what volunteers can expect from our school. Prospective volunteers will also be required to complete a routine Enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service Check application ("DBS check"), before starting to help in school.
